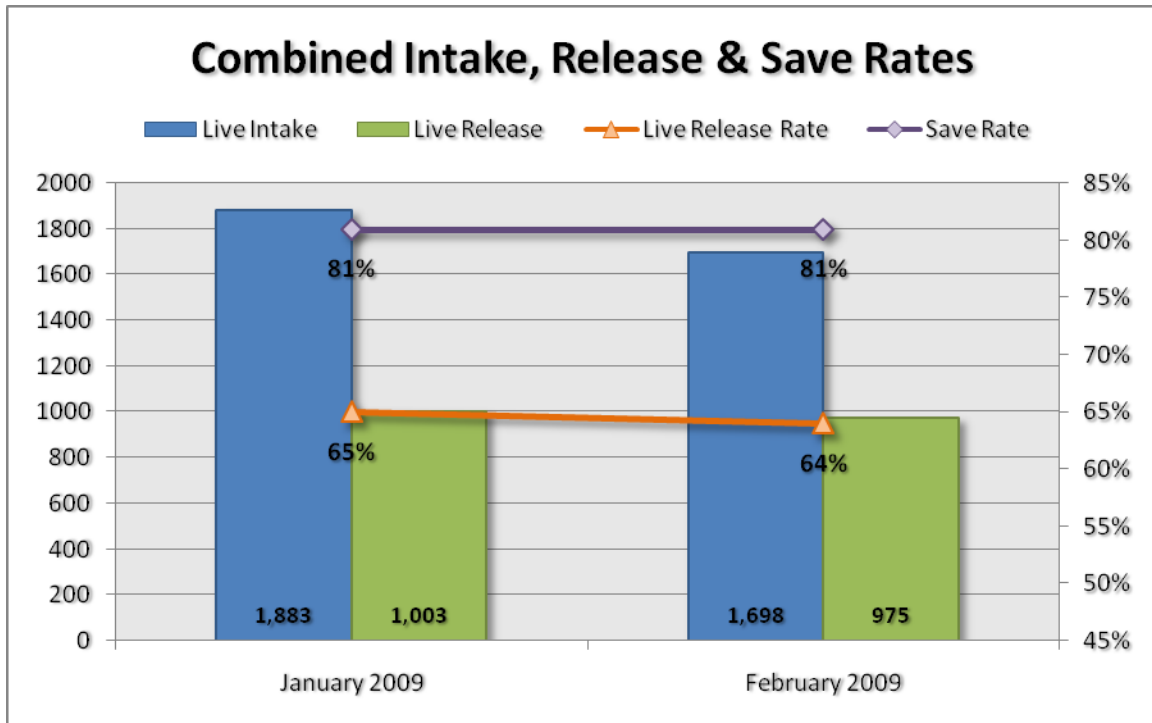


# 2009 Monthly Statistics for ACCT Animal Outcomes

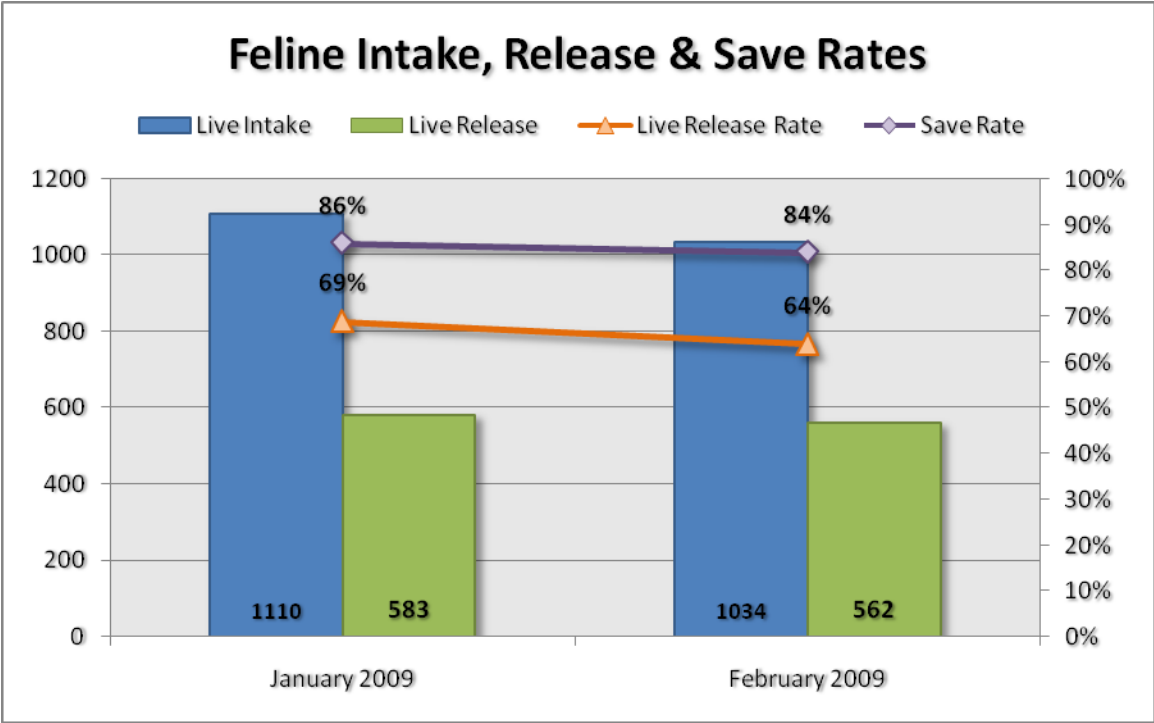
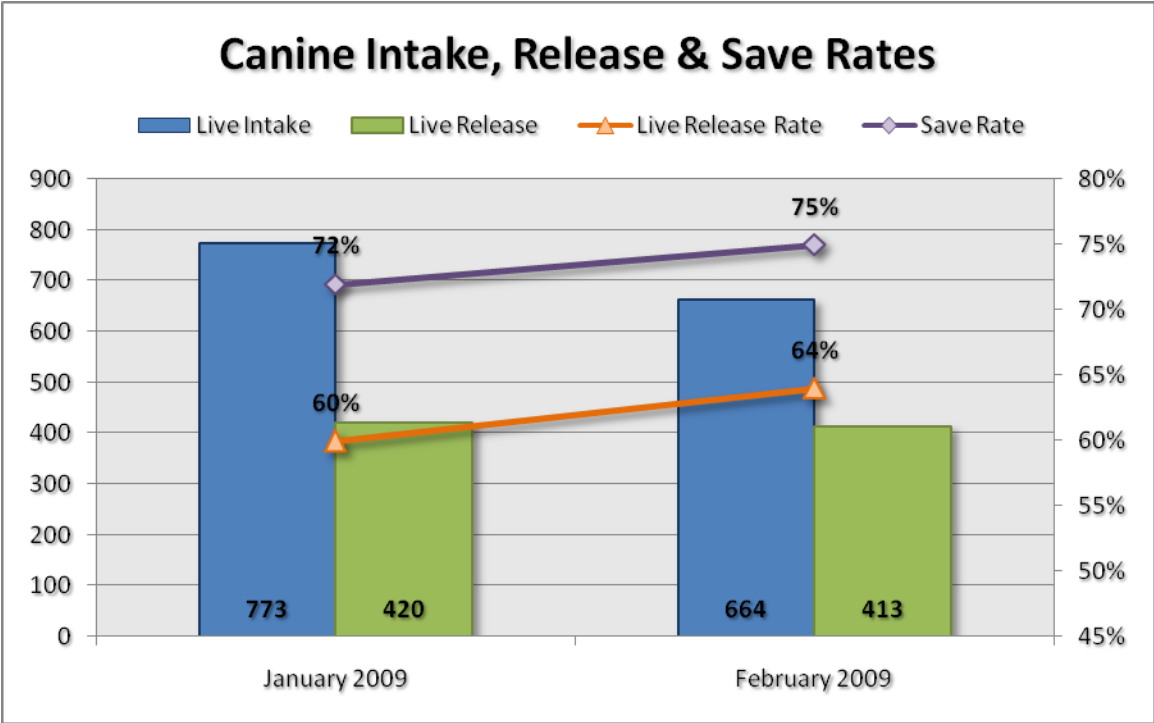


Live Release Rate is calculated by dividing total live outcomes (adoptions, outgoing transfers, and returned to owner) by total outcomes (total live outcomes plus euthanasia not including owner/guardian requested euthanasia or died/lost in shelter/care).

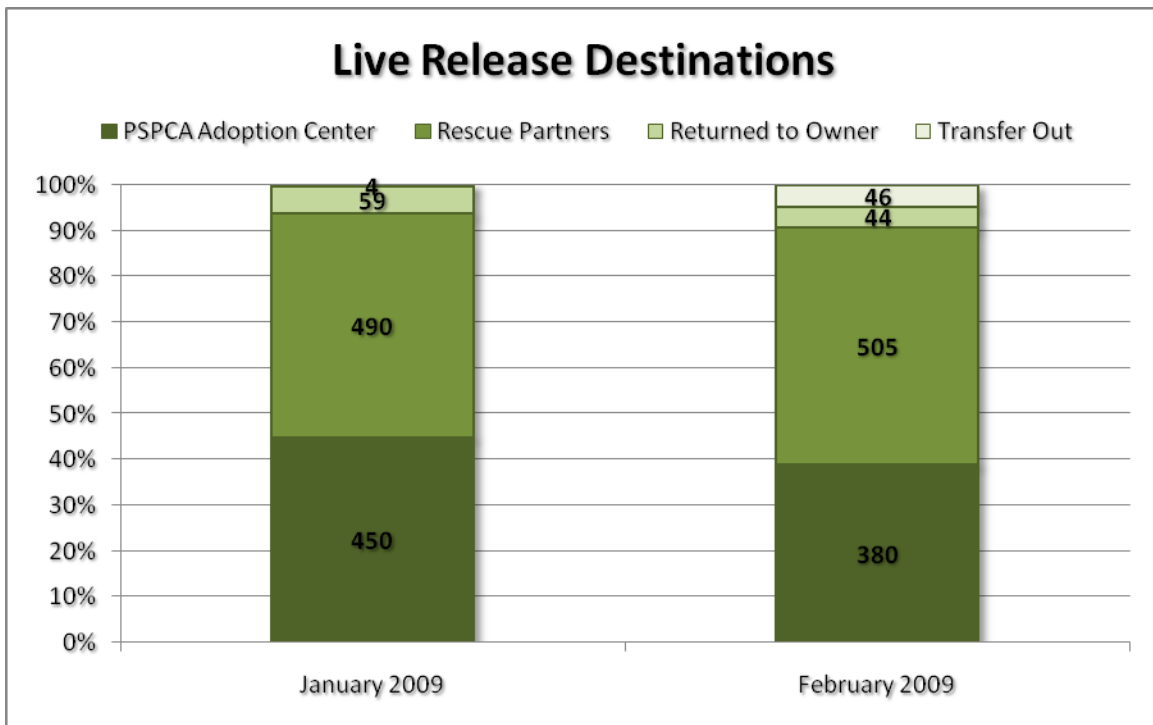
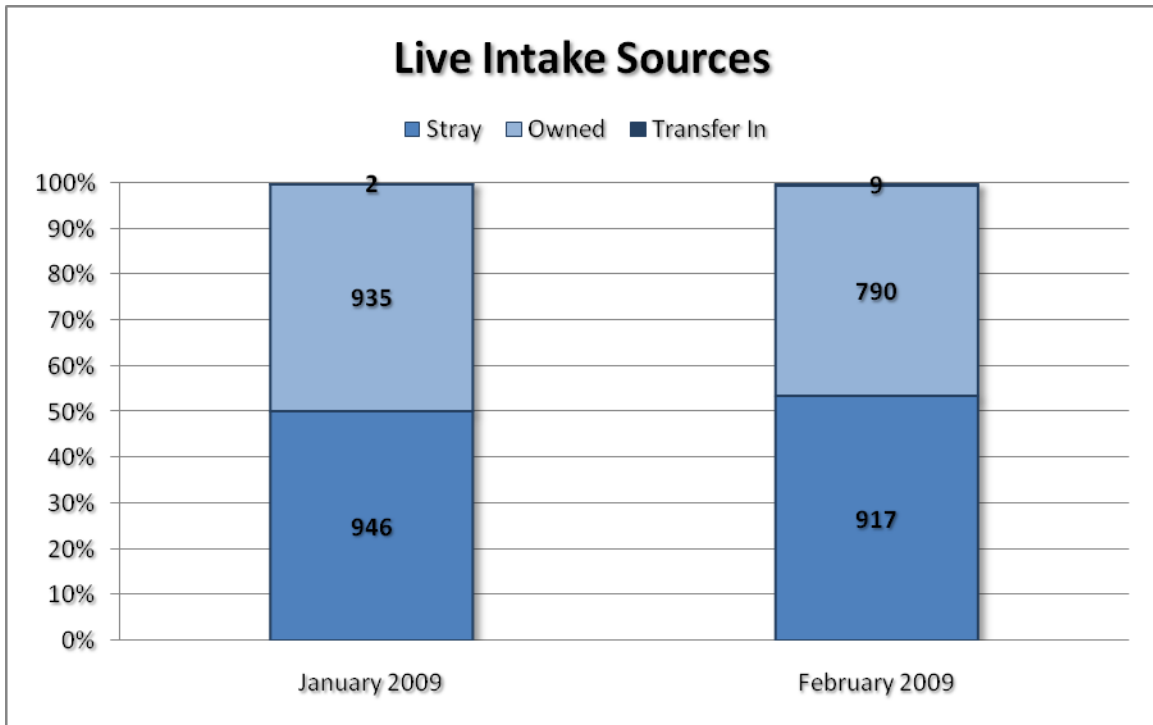
The Live Release Rate for February 2009 does not include 28 owner requested euthanasia, 14 cats and dogs that died or were lost in the shelter/care, and 126 cats and dogs that were dead on arrival.

Save Rate is calculated by dividing Adjusted Euthanasia (total euthanasia excluding owner requested euthanasia) by Total Live Intake including animals in shelter and foster on the last day of the month and subtracting the result from 1.

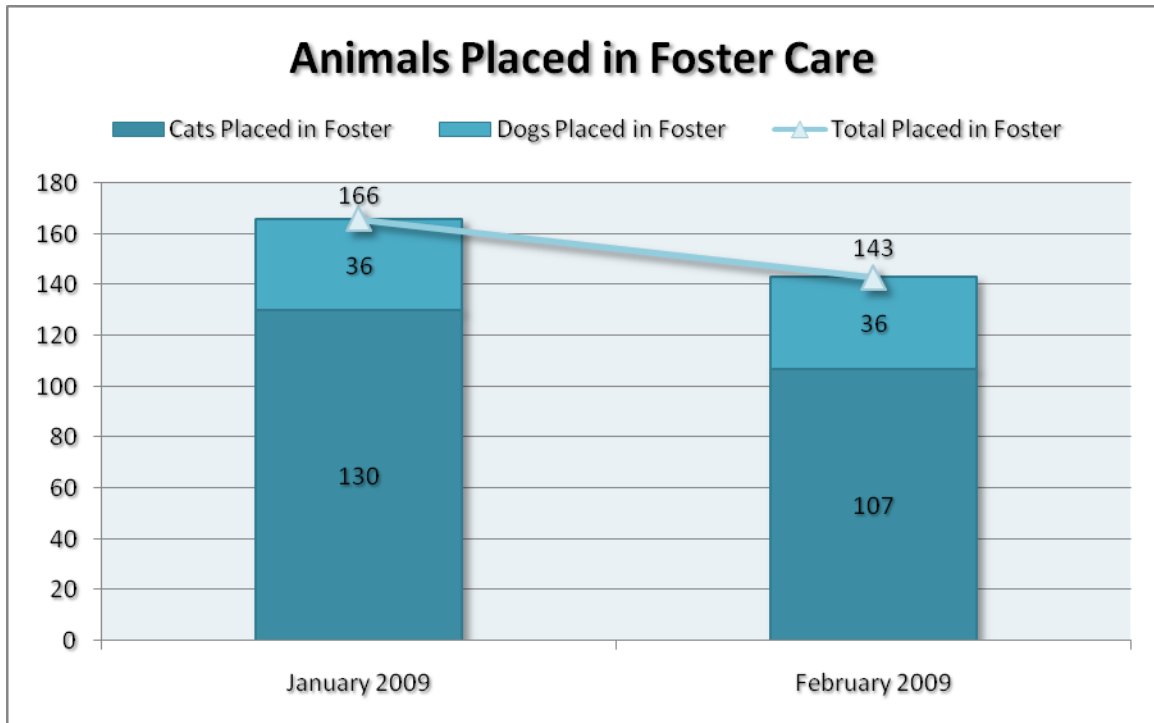

The ACCT Foster Program is one of the many life saving arms of the PSPCA. The primary reason for foster care is to provide a temporary home for a potentially adoptable animal whose current condition is not manageable in a shelter setting. PSPCA ACCT receives more animals than there is space, and so moving animals into foster homes not only saves them, but also the animal that gets their old cage space.
